




Nurse Honor Guard

As we remember and commemorate the lives of our loved ones, we seek to find meaningful ways to acknowledge the contributions they have made to each of us personally and to our community. In 2024, a group of retired and active nurses, with the help of MHP, created a Nurse Honor Guard to assist families in honoring the lives of loved ones who were nurses.

Our Nurse Honor Guard members are volunteer nurses who consider it a privilege to participate in the final celebrations of life for their fellow nurses. Their services are provided as a gift to families in commemoration of their loved ones who were active or retired nurses in the MHP service area.



Nurse Honor Guard Offered Services

The MHP Nurse Honor Guard will participate in visitation or funeral services at the family's request by:

- Providing a table display at the funeral home to honor the loved one's commitment to the nursing profession.
- Standing guard at the nurse's casket during visitation.
- Reciting "A Nurse's Prayer" at a brief ceremony during the visitation, funeral or graveside service. Announcing the last call to duty for the nurse, extinguishing the Florence Nightingale Lamp's flame, and presenting the lamp to a designated family member.
- Providing commemorative bookmarks in remembrance of the honored nurse.
